

Workforce Monitoring: Data Quality; Minimum Data Sets

BHWET Program

- Aims to strengthen capacity of the workforce by supporting interdisciplinary clinical internships and/field placement programs
- Awards made across professional and paraprofessional/certificate tracks
- Study purpose: determine best practices, evaluation strategies, and toolkit for the BHWET program



Methods:

- Recruited 197 grantees into the study
- Conducted 30-60 minute interviews with 53 BHWET program representatives via telephone from June-August 2018
- Survey Development
 - Professional-level BHWET programs
 - Paraprofessional-level BHWET programs
 - Clinical training sites that host BHWET students

BHWET Evaluation Interview Themes

- Student training experiences
- Program evaluation strategies
- Student retention practices
- Public benefit of the program
- Student graduate outcomes
- Loan forgiveness program participation
- Toolkit ideas

Results:

BHWET Program Strengths

- Clinical and academic instruction and training in integrated behavioral health
- Student retention practices
- Cultural competency training
- Substance use disorder training
 - SBIRT
 - Patient simulation
- Faculty responsive to student and evaluation feedback

"[Students] appreciate the opportunity to participate in the trainings, seminars, the valueadded education...They like the fact that it's hands-on and it's about applying knowledge and skills to practice...and to meet with practitioners in the community to learn more about a particular area of behavioral health, or to develop more specialized skills."

Results:

Areas of Opportunity

- Standardize integrated behavioral health curriculum and practice competencies
- Distribution of verified assessments
- Recruitment of diverse student body

"If there were evidence-based tools
...to use to evaluate the program,
that could be helpful...if there was
some instrument that would be
really easy for the settings we're in
to kind of give us numbers on
access to care and client outcomes
in the semesters that we have
project participants there."

Results:

Toolkit Feedback

- Cloud-based
- Adaptable to programs across disciplines and institutions
- Centralized networking database
- Matched mentoring opportunities
- BHWET 101 guide

"It would be great to have one cloud-based repository for information, where you could upload like, "Here's a brief summary of [...] our program. This is a basic idea of how we're conducting our evaluation. If you're interested, get in touch with us, we'd be happy to talk more and here's our contact information."
